Local History: General William T. Sherman ordered Fort Coeur d/Alene to be constructed on the lake in 1870. The City of Coeur d'Alene began near this historic site. In 1880, the U.S. Army constructed the steamship The Amelia Wheaton to carry hay and supplies for Fort Coeur d'Alene. Later, a long list of commercial steamers began plying the waters of Coeur d'Alene Lake in 1884.				
Park History: In 1996, IDPR entered into a management agreement with the Department of Transportation to manage and operate the Coeur d'Alene Parkway.
