History

Local History: In 1848, Father Peter De Smet began building the Old Mission. It was completed in 1853. It soon became a "station of hospitality and supplies" for those passing through the area. The Coeur d Alene Reservation was established in 1877. Father Joseph Cataldo made it his headquarters for ministering to the Couer d'Alene people.

Park History: On July 4, 1961, the Old Mission was designated a National Historic Landmark. In 1975, the Old Mission became a state historic park under the care of IDPR through a long-term lease with the Catholic Diocese of Boise. In 1976, IDPR obtained a lease to a parcel of land that surrounds the Old Mission site. On August 15, 2001, the diocese conveyed ownership of the Old mission site to the Coeur d'Alene Tribe. The parcel of land that surrounds the Old Mission site is sold. The Sacred Encounters Visitor Center was opened in 2009. The new owner of the parcel of land that surrounds the Old Mission site asks for an increae in the lease rate in 2012 and IDPR declines. This causes the loss of the lower parking lot and several surrounding historical sites.
